

Keep your software updated

Many people will be getting to grips with the new phones and smart devices they received as Christmas presents, but how many will remember to enable automatic software updates on them?

Software updates are an important part of staying secure online. Whilst often these are 'advertised' as providing new features or performance improvements they also provide bug fixes and security improvements. Out-of-date software and apps contain weaknesses, which make them easier to hack. Companies fix the weaknesses by releasing updates.

Updating your devices and software helps to keep hackers out.



All devices contain a lot of personal data that is highly valuable if it fell into the hands of a fraudster (the user's full name, date of birth,

address, bank details, passwords, as well as many other forms of personal data such as private photos or videos. So keep them as safe as possible by enabling automatic updates.

There are a number of scam and phishing emails circulating at the moment (e-watch contains regular details and security alerts). If you receive a suspicious email please forward to: report@phishing.gov. uk and they will collate and get these removed. If you think you have been a victim of this or any other scam, contact your Bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police. uk or call 0300 123 2040.

FRAUD ISN'T JUST A SCAM IT'S A CRIME

Watch Out

The killer gas you can't see, smell or taste

Carbon monoxide (CO) can be given off by any appliance which burns a fossil fuel such as gas, coal or oil. It can enter a room if your appliance is faulty, or if the room is not properly ventilated, or the chimney or flue is blocked.

If you breathe enough of it, it can cause permanent heart, lung or brain damage, or even kill.

To make sure appliances are safe, have them properly installed and regularly maintained. Gas

appliances must be serviced by engineers who are members of the Gas Safe Register.

Danger signs

- Gas flames that burn orange or yellow instead of blue
- Stains, soot or discolouring around a fire or water heater
- An unusual smell when an appliance is on
- Solid fuel appliances that burn slowly or go out

How to protect yourself

- Have your appliances regularly serviced by a qualified Gas Safe Registered engineer
- Make sure your home is properly ventilated - never block vents
- Ensure all chimneys and flues are regularly swept and kept clear
- If you are buying a carbon monoxide detector make sure you buy it from a reputable outlet, such as a DIY store or supermarket.

Ideally you should put a carbon monoxide detector in or near every room with a heating or cooking appliance. They can be battery operated or mains powered by plugging direct into a mains socket.

Symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning are similar to a cold or flu and can include the following:

 headaches, sleepiness, nausea/ vomiting, short-term memory loss, chronic fatigue or exhaustion, shortness of breath and chest pain, depression or anxiety, palpitations, disorientation, unconsciousness.

A simple blood test can find out whether someone is suffering from CO exposure. If carbon monoxide poisoning is suspected get the victim into fresh air quickly.
